We are to be a living sacrifice. Totally, completely surrendered to the will of God, serving

We are to spend our energy encouraging and uplifting one another. A critical spirit is not

Rather than a critical spirit, we are to be seekers of unity. Jesus' prayer, in John 17, is asking the Father that we would be one as He is one with the Father. This can only happen when we fulfill His command to love one another.

We are to have a non-judgmental attitude toward one another. The true follower is a servant of Jesus Christ; therefore, Christ has the say of His own servant, not us.

Following "do not judge" comes the command to support and encourage the weaker brother. With our humble spirit, we encourage our brothers and sisters as they journey to spiritual

We are commanded to live in our society with a Christ-like attitude. Jesus taught us that living in a corrupt world does not negate our responsibility to behave in a godly manner. We are called not to bring a reproach to the name of Christ.
